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

TICAD IV Follow-Up

Africa is the top priority in allocating the budget:

- Utmost flexibility and responsiveness shown to project proposals in Africa;
- Supplementary budget prioritized for Africa;
- Environmental program grant aid vigorously applied;
- Energetically formulating new projects in ODA loan eligible countries; and
- Consultation on-going with Angola, Ghana and Nigeria to restart ODA loan projects.
- Preparatory survey missions dispatched more promptly and frequently than any other regions;




Concrete steps to fulfill the commitments

-Preparatory Survey Missions-

- 75 missions dispatched, of those,
 25 completed (as of September 1, 2009)
- 20 projects were formulated based on the mission findings
- > 33 more missions planned
- Regional balance / priority of the country respected



Regional Distribution by sector







Goal of the Initiative

Double rice harvest within 10 years from the present production of 14 million tons to 28 million tons

Establishment of Rice Development Model



The Second CARD Meeting

Coalition for African Rice Development

(June 3 - 4, 2009, Tokyo)

- 140 Participants from African and Asian Governments, International Agencies and Diplomatic Missions in Tokyo
- Recognized the political will towards the implementation of CARD at highest level possible
- Sharing lessons leant from the 1st Group countries









Example 3: Financial Crisis Special training courses established for Africa

Ministerial Follow-up Meeting (Botswana, March 2009) adopted the Communiqué emphasizing the negative impact on African continent

10 new training courses established:

"Seminars on measures against global financial and economic crisis"

- capacity development of the financial sector;
- at least 10 participants per course;
- expected to start as soon as this November.
