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I. Introduction and Executive summary

1 Introduction

'Eritrea: Essential Education Indicators is the official, annual education publication of the Ministry of Education (MOE) dealing with basic essential indicators. This is the ninth report produced by the Department of Research and Human Resource Development in terms of organization of schools in the new six administrative regions, the Zobas. The sources of information for this publication are annual school censuses carried out by Zoba education offices through standard questionnaires filled by each school.

This publication covers Early Childhood Education (ECE) General Education (Elementary, Middle and Secondary levels), Adult Education, Technical Vocational Education and Training. The main purpose of the 2004/05 publication is to provide relevant, reliable and up-to-date information on education in Eritrea. It will thus serve as a source of useful information for the various stakeholders within and outside the education sector.

The data presented in this publication is comprehensive and detailed. It is expected to be useful for planning, decision making and for conducting research. Nevertheless, the Ministry of Education is making further efforts to improve the quality, timeliness, and coverage of the education statistics.

This publication would not have been possible without the valuable contributions of the six Zoba education offices and the other educational institutions. We remain deeply indebted to all of them for their commendable efforts and collaboration.

We are grateful to UNICEF: Eritrea office for its support in printing this publication. We also extend our appreciation to all those who have provided us with feedbacks.

2. Executive summary

In the 2004/05 academic year enrolment in elementary education has increased by 0.7 percent and enrolment in elementary special needs education has increased by 3.95 as compared to 2003/04. The increase in elementary enrolment has mainly been witnessed in the Debub, Maekel, and Semienawi Keih Bahri regions. Enrolment at the middle level has increased by 13.1%. This has mainly taken place in the Debub, Maekel and Semienawi Keih Bahri regions. Enrolment in Secondary schools has increased by 9.6%, with almost all the regions registering increases at this level.

Enrolment of girls in elementary education in 2004/05 in Eritrea, as compared to 2003/04, has increased by 1.0 percent, and enrolment of girls in government schools has increased by about 0.5 percent.

As compared to 2003/04, the national enrolment of girls and boys in 2004/05 has increased by 4.4 percent. However, the participation ratio of girls is still lower than that of boys, except in the literacy programme, where the participation of women stands at 88.4 percent. The Gross Enrolment ratios of female pupils in pre-primary, elementary, middle and secondary schools have been 50.2 percent, 44.4 percent 38.8 percent and 34.2 percent respectively.

The numbers of schools, students and teachers in pre-primary education have increased by 196 percent, 68.5 percent and 71.7 percent respectively. The number of schools has increased by 0.9 percent at the elementary level and by 10.2 percent at the middle school level, while at the secondary level it has increased by 26.1 percent. The numbers of teachers at the elementary and secondary levels decreased by 1.1 percent and 2.1 percent respectively, while at the middle school level it has increased by 9.2 percent.

The national gross enrolment rates in 2004/05 were 16.3 percent, 71.73 percent, 48.4 percent and 24.0 percent in pre-primary, elementary, middle and secondary education respectively. Enrolment in special needs education has increased by approximately 4 percent.

The total number of schools in the 2004/05 academic year has been 870. These have comprised of 764 elementary schools, 205 middle schools and 58 secondary schools.

3 Data channels

The information in this statistical abstract is gathered mainly from routine Questionnaires 7, 8 and 9. The first two are closed questionnaires, in which schools and institutions send back the *November data* on pre-primary, primary, secondary, special, technical schools and TTI's to the MOE. The data include educational expenditure, adult literacy and evening classes. The expected time of completion of these questionnaires is April. In every academic year normally 100% of the questionnaires are collected.

Routine Questionnaire 9 mainly relates to a school's physical, financial and internal efficiency particulars. The expected time of completion of this Questionnaire is July, after the end of each academic year in the country.

We assure users of this abstract that all means have been pursued to make the information provided in this issue very highly valid and reliable.

Data in all tables, unless otherwise stated, refer to the 2004/05 academic year. Table numbers are sub-grouped under corresponding sections. Charts are sequenced in a continuous ascending order all through the abstract.

II. Important notes

1. Population

1.1 For the purpose of this issue the population estimate 3,397,515 is used to derive essential educational indicators, it is also used in splitting the population into single age population.

We would like to remind users of our yearly abstracts that we have been using different population estimation in our previous publications. We have used the new population estimation, which is considered to be a better estimation, as a base to calculate school-age population and thus enrolment and other essential indicators as well.

5. Definitions

- 5.1 Government schools are schools administered and financed by the Ministry of Education.
- **5.2 Non-government schools** are schools administered and financed by institutions other than the Ministry of Education.
 - **5.2.1. Domestic Community schools** are schools administered by municipalities or local committees.
 - **5.2.2. Foreign Community schools** are schools administered by foreign communities (Italian etc. communities).
 - **5.2.3.** Awkaf (Mahad) schools are schools administered by Awkaf (Islamic religion association).
 - **5.2.4. Mission schools** are schools administered by churches (Coptic, Catholic, and Protestant churches).
- **5.3 Special schools** are schools for the deaf and the blind. There are two schools for the deaf, one in Keren and another in Asmera and one school for the blind in Asmera.

5.4 Number of schools by level:

A school having grades 1-11(12) is considered as three (1-5, 6-8, 9-12) schools by **level** regardless of being single **site**; another having grades 1-8 is considered as two schools as it contains two levels (1-5 and 6-8) etc.

5.5. Number of schools by site:

One single school compound or **site** may accommodate a combination of two or three level of schools but may be counted as one school **for purposes of specific location.** The number of schools by level is always greater than the number of schools by site.

IV. Pre-primary level

1. Pre-primary schools

In 2004/05 there were 359 pre-primary schools in the whole country. 104 (29.0%) of them are located in Zoba Maekel. Out of which 41 (40%) are located in Asmara, the capital city.

In the academic year 2004/05 only 231 (64%) out of the 359 schools were government owned, while the rest of the schools, 128(35.6%) were non-government owned.

2. Pre-primary enrolment

In this level, children of ages 5 and 6 are enrolled in pre-primary education. The gross enrolment ratio for the academic years 1991/92 and 2003/2004 were 4.3% and 9.1% respectively. But, in the academic year 2004/05 the gross enrolment ratios increased to 16.3%.

3. Pre-primary teachers

During the academic year 2004/2005 there were 845 pre-primary teachers in the whole country of whom 555 (65.7%) had professional training. 277 females and 13 male teachers were without any training. The number of teachers in pre-primary schools as seen in the following tables is very low. The opening of new pre-primary schools will therefore require training of new teachers.

As table 7 indicates almost all (816 which is 96.6%) teachers in pre-primary schools are females. In the academic year 1993/94 only one teacher, in 1995/96 other two male teachers and in 1998/99 other six male teachers joined the teaching force. In 2003/2004 the number of male teachers was only 21 and in 2004/05 the number of male teachers has increased by 8 while, the number of female teachers increased by 345.

V. Elementary level

1. Duration

In this level children of ages 7-11 are enrolled from grades 1-5. Education in this level is free and compulsory.

Starting from 1991/92 academic year enrolment at the elementary level has been steadily increasing. At this level, Medium of instruction is the mother tongue.

2. Enrolment

Enrolment in this level for the year 2004/2005 was 377,512 out of which 167,451 (44.4%) were females. Out of the total enrolment in elementary schools, 347,650 (7.9%) were enrolled in non-government schools.

As can be noted in Table 11, the gross admission ratio dropped continuously from 61.08% to 45.88% between 1991/92 and 1996/97 (except for 1995/96 academic year). The gross admission ratio started to increase from 1997/98 and reached 71.41 in 2002/2003.and dropped to 66.57, and 67.68 in 2003/04 and 2004/05 respectively.

Table 13 indicates that the percentage of over-age pupils has been decreasing every academic year, except for the 1997/98 and 2002/03 academic years. In the academic year 2003/04and 2004/05 the percentage of over-age students in grade 1 was 46.9 and 40.9 percent respectively. Although progress has been made in decreasing over age students more effort is needed to overcome this challenge.

From the academic year 1991/92 until the academic year 1997/98 except for the academic year 1996/97 enrolment of under-age was continuously decreasing. This was mainly because MOE regulations in those years did not allow children under 7 to be enrolled in elementary schools. Starting from the year 1997/98 the enrolment of under-age children increased continuously. This development could be explained by the ministry's apparent permission to register children of 6 years of age.

VIII. Internal efficiency

1. Length of school year.

The duration of the school year in the academic year 2004/05 was 197 days in the highlands and 192 days in the lowlands. In both locations the number of periods per week in grades 1-2 and 3-5 was 25 and 35 respectively. (There are 5 periods for grades 1-2 in a day and 7 periods for grades 3-5 in a day). In other grades the number of periods per week is 35.

In the academic year 2004/2005, schooling in the highlands began in September 20 and ended in June 30. In the lowlands it began in September 20 and ended in May 30. Schools in the lowlands teach 6 days a week while schools in the highlands teach 5 days a week.

The duration of the school year in the academic 2004/2005 is shown in table 31.
