Silver Jubilee Independence Celebrations Commenced with the Lighting of the Independence Torch

Eritrea's Silver Jubilee Independence Celebrations commenced on 15 January through a ceremony of lighting of the Independence Torch in the historic town of Nakfa.



The Independence Torch will cover more than three thousand kilometers in all the Regions of the country and reach Asmara, Eritrea's capital on Independence Day, 24 May 2016.

Extensive preparations are already underway inside the country and abroad for the celebration of the Silver Jubilee of Independence Day under the theme "Quarter of Century of Resilience and Development".

The Silver Jubilee Independence Day celebrations will include cultural shows, symposiums, sports competitions, military parades, carnivals as well as children's programs. Thousands of Eritreans residing abroad and friends of Eritrea are expected to participate at the celebrations.

China is striving for the achievement of the two Centenary Goals by the mid of the Century and Eritrea is moving steadfast on its road of development through resilience.

We are strong and good partners in this grand cause. Let’s join hands together and seize the opportunities to further deepen China-Eritrea cooperation in all areas to the benefit of our two countries and peoples to a larger extent.
